2. Background to the business: research some basic facts:

- Research the term "Annual Report for (your chosen PLC") e.g. Tesco plc annual report
- Download the PDF
- > Read the chairman's and CEO message at front of the report
- ➤ Look through the pack to find the financial information (Income statement) this will show the revenue and profit.
- Investigate the range of products / services they offer

Explain the following

- What does the business do? (look at their <u>full</u> range of products and services)
- ➤ How large is it? (number of stores, employees etc)
- > Where is it based?
- > What are its key objectives? (Hint: look in the Chairman's statement in the annual report)

3. How successful is it?

Give evidence (Think about numbers: sales revenue, profit, market share etc. and get facts and figures). See if you can compare them to a large competitor.

4. Has it become more or less successful over the last few years?

(again, get evidence from annual report, compare financial figure such as revenue and profit for a few years)

5. What do you think are the key factors that might affect its success and why?

Think about the markets it is in, competitors, Government regulation, the economy, its financial situation etc.

6. Evaluate the impact the coronavirus has or will have on this business.

To what extent will CV-10 impact in this business in the short term and in the long term?

Write your report; Title: Business Insight: COMPANY NAME

- Prepare a report, based on the headings in this table
- No more than 3 pages.
- This should be typed in font size 12 with clear headings and sub-headings.
- This MUST be in your own words not copy and pasted from the internet (unless you are using a quote or image, in which case you must state the exact URL.)




READING



1. Up In The Air with George Clooney (2010);

Up in the Air is a 2009 American comedy-drama film directed by Jason Reitman and written by Reitman and Sheldon Turner, based on the career of J Weller. The story is centered on corporate "downsizer" Ryan Bingham (George Clooney) and his travels.

The film examines the 2001 collapse of the Enron Corporation which resulted in criminal trials for several of the company's top executives during the ensuing Enron scandal it also shows the involvement of the Enron traders in the California electricity crisis.

This film follows the lives of four unethical Chicago real estate agents who are prepared to go to any lengths (legal or illegal) to unload undesirable real estate on unwilling prospective buyers.


